Though there is no substitute for experiencing Charleston's oldest public building first-hand, our education staff is committed to tell the stories of historic Charleston wherever we are invited. Please consider one of the following in classroom programs where the history comes to you!



## *In Classroom Programs*

- ★ All presentations are presented by an educator in 18<sup>th</sup> century period attire. Like our museum programs, we can emphasize particular aspects of history based on the needs of the teacher. In classroom presentations are priced based on how many interpreters you require and for what length of time. Generally our rate is \$60.00 per educator/per hour. Each presentation is designed to accommodate a 40 to 60 minute class period with approximately 20 to 60 students at a time.
  
- ★ Most presentations include both an “interactive lecture” and “hands-on learning.” Your presenter will provide all materials required with exception for any technical equipment required if teacher would like to include PowerPoint, etc. Depending on which program you select, presentations will cover colonial, pirate, or Revolutionary War history, clothing, daily-life items, and toys. Also, students will learn about the colonial coopersmith through our “bucket-construction” activity.

Below are your options for in-class presentations. Programs #1, #2, and #3 can adapt to any student’s level of study. Options #4, #5, and #6 are designed exclusively for Jr. High and High School students.
